John D. Jameson



John D. "Jack" Jameson of Plumstead Township passed away Wednesday, May 24, 2017, at the age of 84 ½ years.

He was the loving and devoted husband of Martha Sue (High) Jameson for 64 ½ years.

Born in Philadelphia, he was the son of the late John Band and Edna V. (Graves) Jameson.

Jack was a U.S. Air Force veteran, having served in Korea, Japan, and Vietnam.

He was proud to be a 50-year Boy Scouts of America Gold Cardholder and a lifetime member of

The Guardian's of the Washington Crossing Veterans Cemetery, having been a member of the first Honor Guard at the cemetery on Jan. 10, 2010.

He received nearly every award attainable as an adult Scouter, including the Silver Beaver, yet he was never a Boy Scout. He was Scoutmaster of Troop 175 located at Danboro Reformed Church. During his tenure the troop flourished and had the most number of boys in Troop history.

For many years, Jack portrayed "Klondike Pete" at the annual Lenape District Klondike Derby.

In 2007, Jack was awarded the Pennsylvania American Legion Scouter of the year for his service and dedication to Scouts.

For 45 years Jack spent Christmas Day participating in the reenactment of Washington Crossing the Delaware. Most of the years he was the bow poleman on Washington's boat.

Jack was a 16-year member of the Bucks County Children and Youth advisory board and a 14-year member of Bucks for Kids. He served on the Plumstead Township Veterans Committee and was a member of the Albert R. Atkinson Jr. American Legion Post 210 in Doylestown.

He had a career in auto body painting and at the time had a reputation for excellence. In later years he enjoyed spending time at the Bagel Barrel, where he made friends with everyone.

In addition to his beloved wife, he is survived by sons: Raymond Lee and Ryan John, as well as his granddaughters: Madelynne and Alexandra and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by son, Randall Scott.
